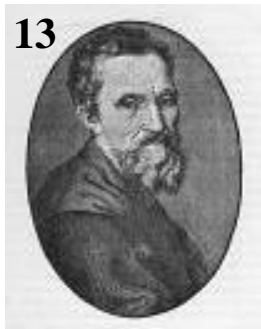
Luciano Pavarotti
