adopted for official state use in 1959

blue field represents the sky, the sea, and mountain lakes, and Alaska's wildflowers

eight gold stars: seven from the the Big Dipper, the other is the North Star, representing Alaska as the northern most state

designed in 1926 by a 13-year-old Native American boy, Bennie Benson

adopted in in 1923 as the state flag

the only state flag that is green

the only state flag with a picture of a president, President George Washington
