Cut the book out in one piece (along the solid outer lines). Cut the sentence strips out along the solid outer lines. Fold the short edge of the book up along the dotted line so that the text is to the outside. Attach the pocket to the main portion of the book (on the right and left sides). Fold the "right" portion of the book over along the dotted line so that the pocket is on the inside. Do the same with the "wrong" portion of the book. The center pocket allows your student a storage spot so he can play this "game" over and over.
