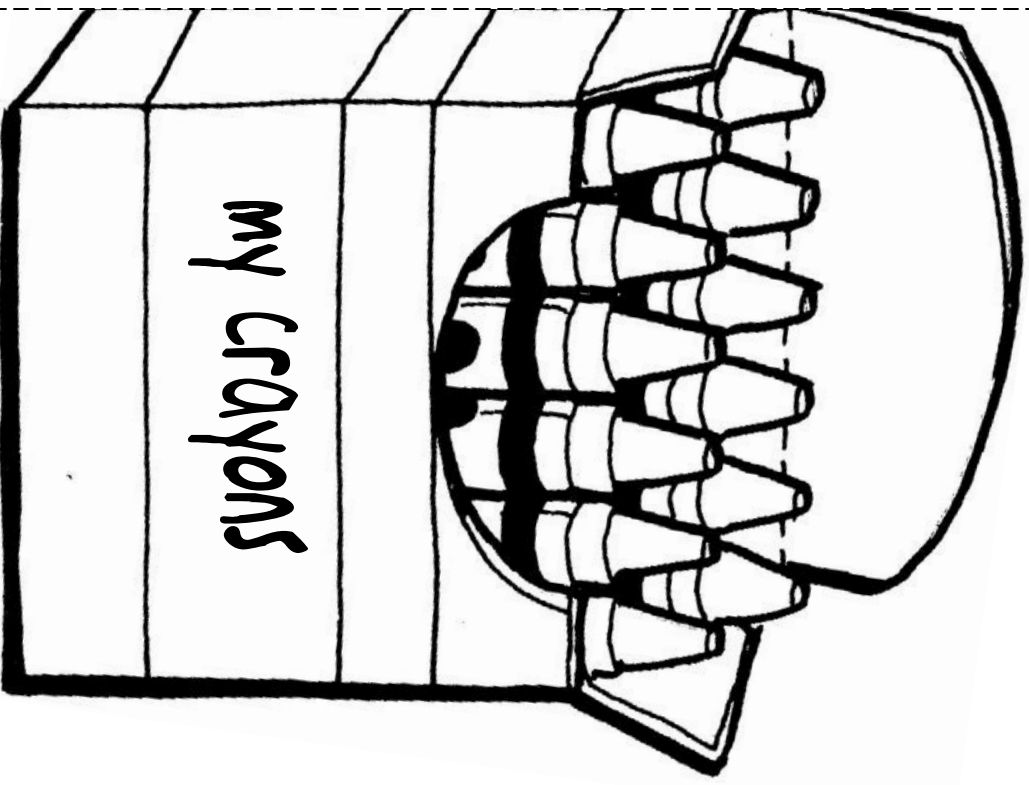
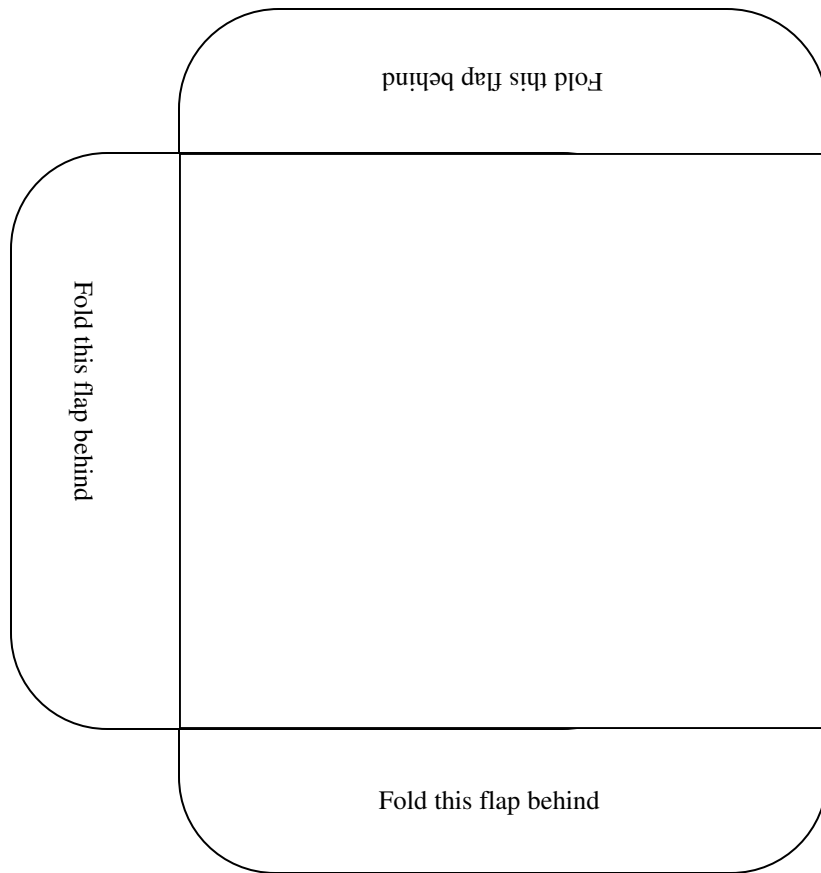


Fold in half on the dotted line and cut book out.





Cut pocket out as one piece. Fold flaps behind and glue pocket (on the flaps) to the inside of the crayon box book. Let your student color the crayons on the next page. Store crayons in the pocket.

To make this into a game:

Print two copies of page three and color two crayons the same color. Use the cards for a memory/matching game. If you choose this option, you will not need to print page four.

OR

Decide what colors you want the six crayons (whatever your student may need to work on). Let your student color the crayons. Print page four. Write the names of the crayons (RED, YELLOW, BLUE, etc.) on each card to match the colors on the crayon cards. When you write the words, use the color to write the word so that your student will easily be able to match the red crayon to the word *RED*, etc. Use the cards for a memory/matching game.
