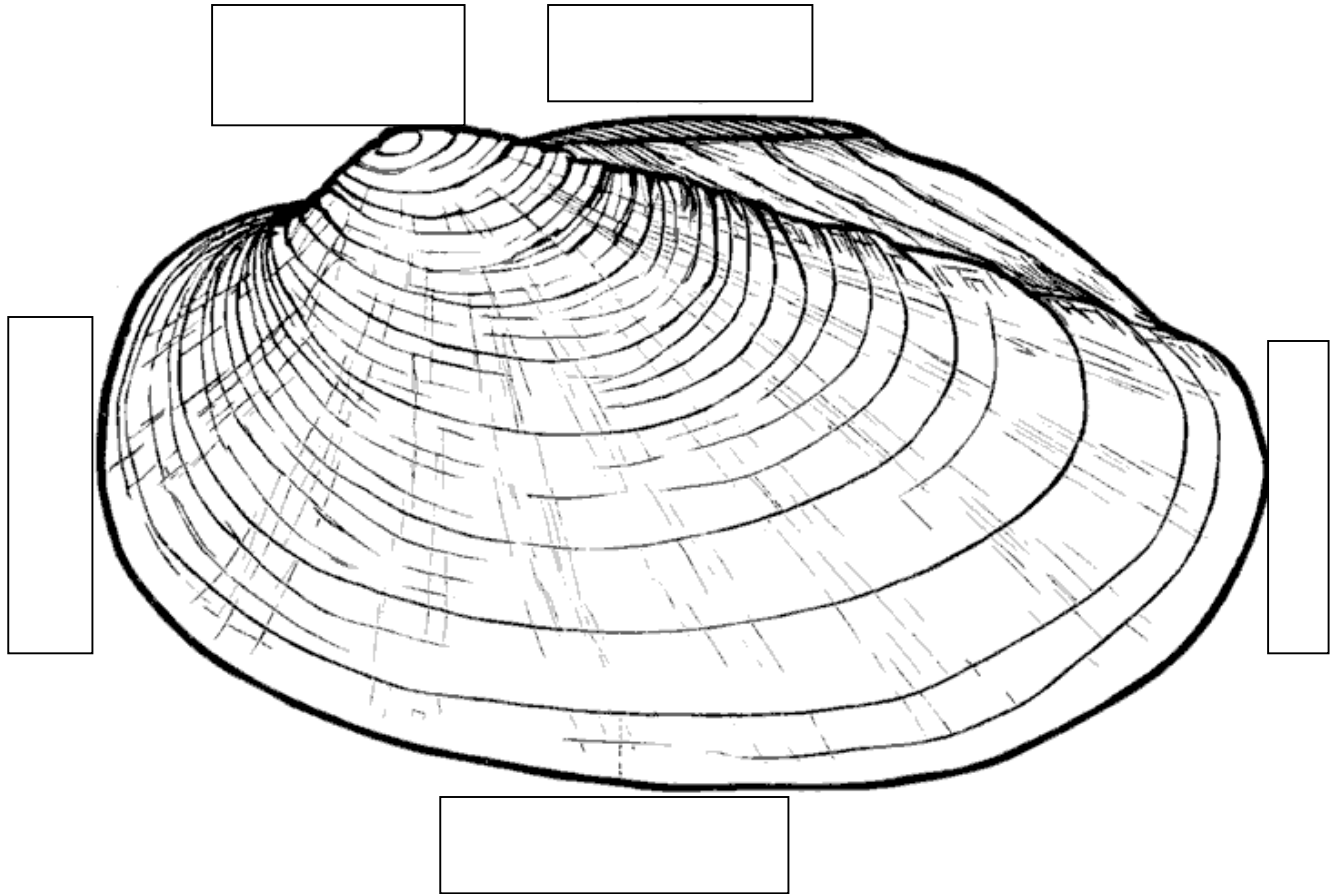


VIVID VERBS
