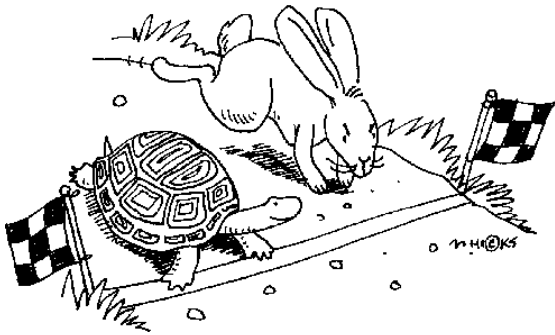


Cut out both pages on solid lines. Staple on left side. Glue into lapbook.
