Directions:

Use the minit book and sentence strips for review after you teach the lesson on page 38 (you probably want to use this activity on a day after you've taught the lesson). Once the book is assembled, read the sentences with your student and encourage him to determine which punctuation mark is needed at the end of the sentence. He can place the sentence strip in that pocket.

After he's done playing the game, the strips can be stored in the middle pocket.

Cut the book out in one piece (along the solid outer lines).
Cut the sentence strips out along the solid outer lines.

Fold the short edge of the book up along the dotted line so that the text is to the outside. Attach the pocket to the main portion of the book (on the right and left sides) using tape.

Fold the question mark portion of the book over along the dotted line so that the pocket is on the inside. Do the same with the period portion of the book.
