





Pizza Shop Menu


You can choose 2-3 items under each category.

Pizza Shop Pretend Play

Ideas:

- 1. You can print your menu for pretend play. Laminate for durability.
- 2. Print the Open and Closed signs.
- 3. Print and laminate the Store Hours sign. Write in the hours with a dry erase marker.
- 4. Print, cut out, and laminate the order tickets. You can write on these with a dry -erase marker to make them re-usable. Print the page more than once, if desired.
- 5. Ask your local pizza place for a cardboard pizza box and use it for your pretend play.
- 6. Use large felt pieces and cardboard to make pizza parts for your students to make pizzas for customers.





Directions: Cut out the cover piece on this page. Cut out the graph on next page. Complete the graph. Fold graph in half like a hotdog. Paste cover to the front.








Cheese is sold in two pound packages. Tony wants to buy ten pounds of cheese. How many packages does he need to buy?





Each barrel holds twenty-five pounds of flour. Nino bought 100 pounds. How many barrels will he be able to fill?




Each pepperoni stick makes twenty-five slices. Little Tony sliced six pepperonis off of a stick. How many more pepperonis does he have to slice?








Jack and Joe at lunch at Little Nino's. Jack spent \$6.55, and Joe spent \$7.20. How much more did Joe spend than Jack?

Make a Paper Pizza!



Supplies Needed:

Paper Plate

Scissors

Instructions:

Paint a paper plate red for the sauce. While it is drying, cut shapes from the construction paper to resemble cheese, pepperoni, green pepper, sausage, black olives, and other favorite toppings. Glue the toppings to the plate.
