




Backyard Birds

A bird came down the walk: He did not know I saw, He bit an angle-worm in halves And ate the fellow, raw.


And then he drank a dew From a convenient grass, And then hopped sidewise to the wall To let a beetle pass.


He glanced with rapid eyes That hurried all abroad,--They looked like frightened beads, I thought, He stirred his velvet head



















Cut out book as one piece. Fold left side under. Fold right side under (it is the cover). Unfold book. Cut on the two lines between the names







Cut out book as one piece and fold matchbook style. Use the inside of the book to compare and contrast the anatomy of the male and female.
