4. The Galapagos Islands









4 pounds potatoes, peeled and sliced


1 cup milk

Ceviche de Camaron

2 pounds med shrimp, shelled and de-veined

2 cups orange juice

1 med onion, finely chopped

1 fresh hot red or green pepper, seeded and finely chopped

1 large tomato, peeled, seeded, and chopped

ground pepper and salt

Boil the shrimp in a saucepan of salted water for about 2 to 3 minutes until cooked. Drain the water out and then add orange juice, onion, pepper, tomato, and seasoning. Allow it to stand for an hour. Serve with toasted corn.
