Pages 3-4: ABC Magnet Word Building

Use your alphabet magnets and a cookie sheet to build the words! If you have Montessori ABC letters, you can use page four.

Page 5: Farm Animals Word Find (visual discrimination, literacy)

Find a word. Color in the squares. Find another word. Color the squares with a different color. Continue until all words are found.

Page 6: How Many Eggs? (counting, number recognition, understanding quantities)

Print and laminate page. Mom needs to write numbers in the second column. The student should use play-doh to make eggs. The student should then place the correct amount of eggs for each chicken in the third column.

Page 7: Tally Marks (counting, one-to-one correspondence)

Using a scrap piece of paper, show your student what tally marks are. Grab some simple objects from around your house and show how your student how to count them with tally marks. Complete the page together.

Pages 8-11: Farm Friends Book

Ask your student to color the animals. After she does this, give her the "Color Words" page for reference and help her write the correct color words on the pages. When finished, you can cut the pages out, stack them together, and staple on the top to form a mini-book.

Page 12: Short Vowel Wheel

Print the wheel on cardstock. Color. Laminate. Cut wheel out. Write the letters a, e, I, o, and u on five clothespins. Let your student clip the corresponding clothespin to the correct section of the wheel.

Page 13: My Favorite Farm Animal

Mom can type right on this page! At the end of your study, ask your student what he has learned about his favorite farm animal. Record the information on this page, print it, and put it in his notebook.

Page 14: Tracing (fine motor)


Pages 15-16: Farm Animal Graph (number recognition, quantity, understanding graphs, cooperative play)

Page 18: Farm Animal Tic-Tac-Toe

This is Tic-Tac-Toe with a twist! Print and laminate page. Find 5 markers for each player (suggestion: buttons for one player, paperclips for the other). Teach your student how to play regular Tic-Tac-Toe (if he doesn't already know). Variation: if it's your turn, you must tell the name of the animal's baby (horse = foal, cat = kitten, goat = kid, sheep = lamb, donkey = foal, dog = puppy, pig = piglet, chicken = chick, and cow = calf) in order to play on that square.



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Farm Animal Graph


You can play this cooperative game with 1-4 players. Each player takes a turn rolling a die. Fill in one square of the animal that was rolled (using the chart below to show you the numbers with the corresponding animals). Keep taking turns until one of the animals reaches ten.
