

-humans are responsible for the world, and should take care of it




Directions: Cut book out on solid lines; fold on dotted lines. On the inside of the book, write the definition. Your students can also write what the character quality means in their own words, if desired.



PRINT ON CARDSTOCK. Cut each piece out on the solid black lines. Attach with brass fastener where indicated.

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

Cut the book out in one piece (along the solid outer lines). Cut the sentence strips out along the solid outer lines.


Fold the short edge of the book up along the dotted line so that the text is to the outside. Attach the pocket to the main portion of the book (on the right and left sides). Fold the "right" portion of the book over along the dotted line so that the pocket is on the inside. Do the same with the "wrong" portion of the book. The center pocket allows your student a storage spot so he can play this "game" again.

Cut book out. Fold on lines (matchbook style). Paste the horse inside the book.





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Directions: Cut on dotted lines. After word find is completed, fold in half. Cut out cover piece and paste on front.
