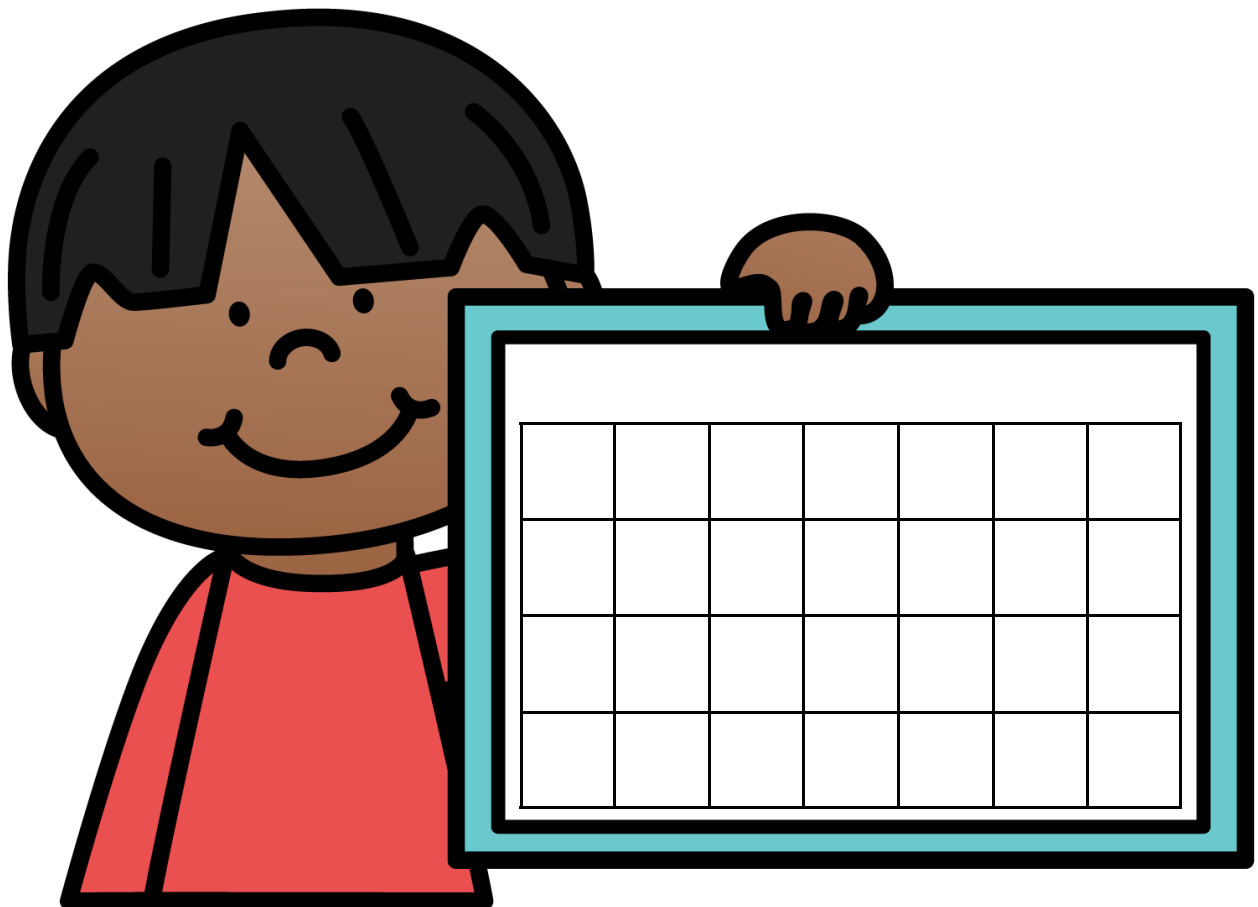


Months of the Year Lapbook

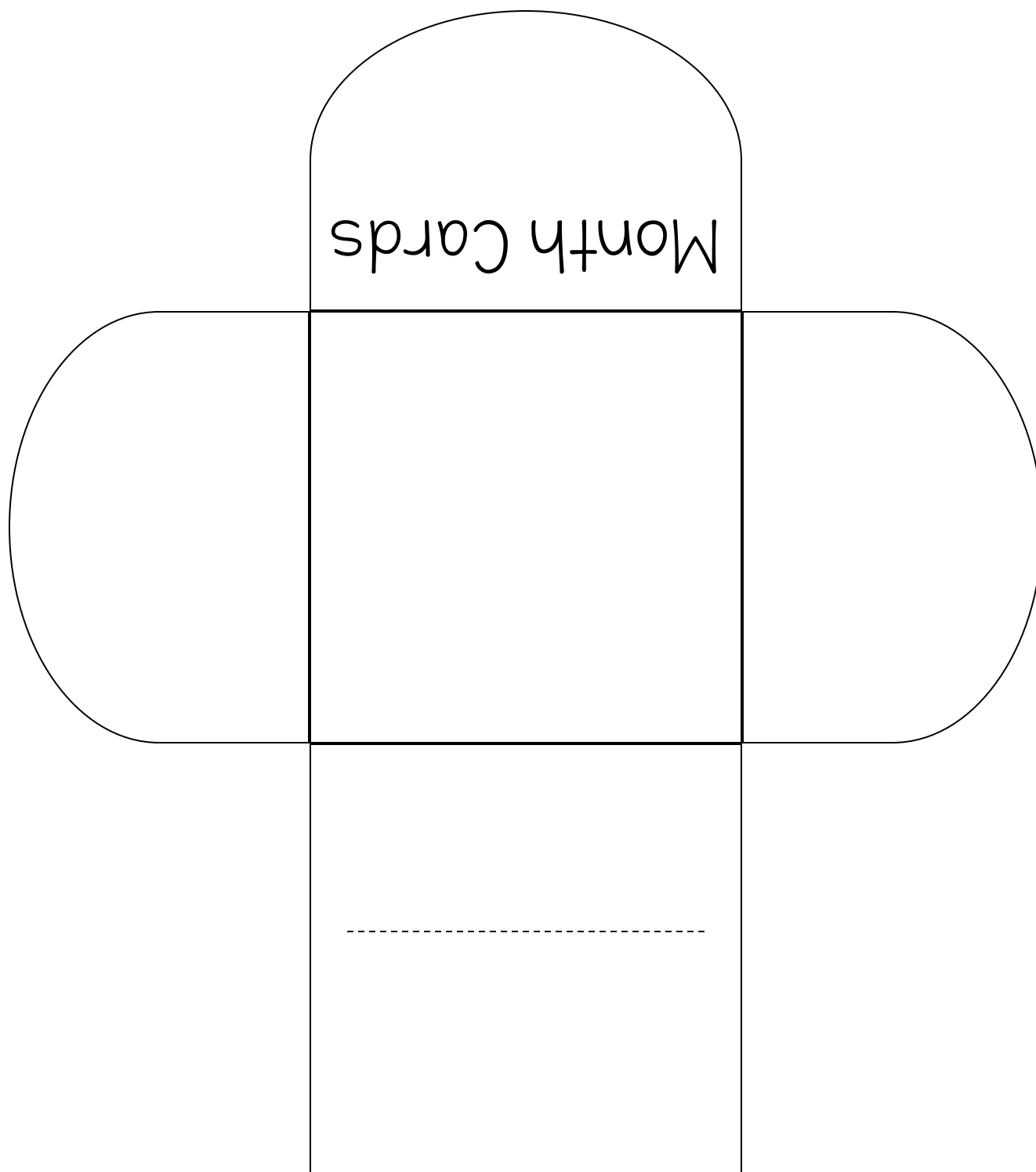


Directions: Print on cardstock. Cut apart. Store pieces in pocket. Use the pieces for your student to put the months of the year in order.












Directions: Cut on solid lines. Fold on dotted. Paste corresponding poem parts (on the next page) under the flaps.

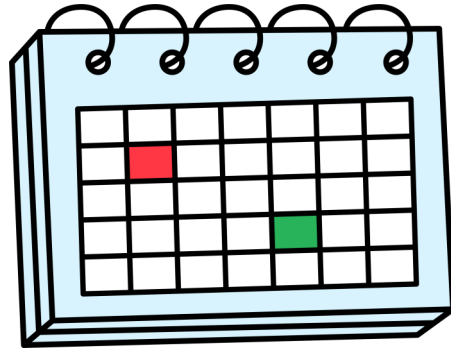

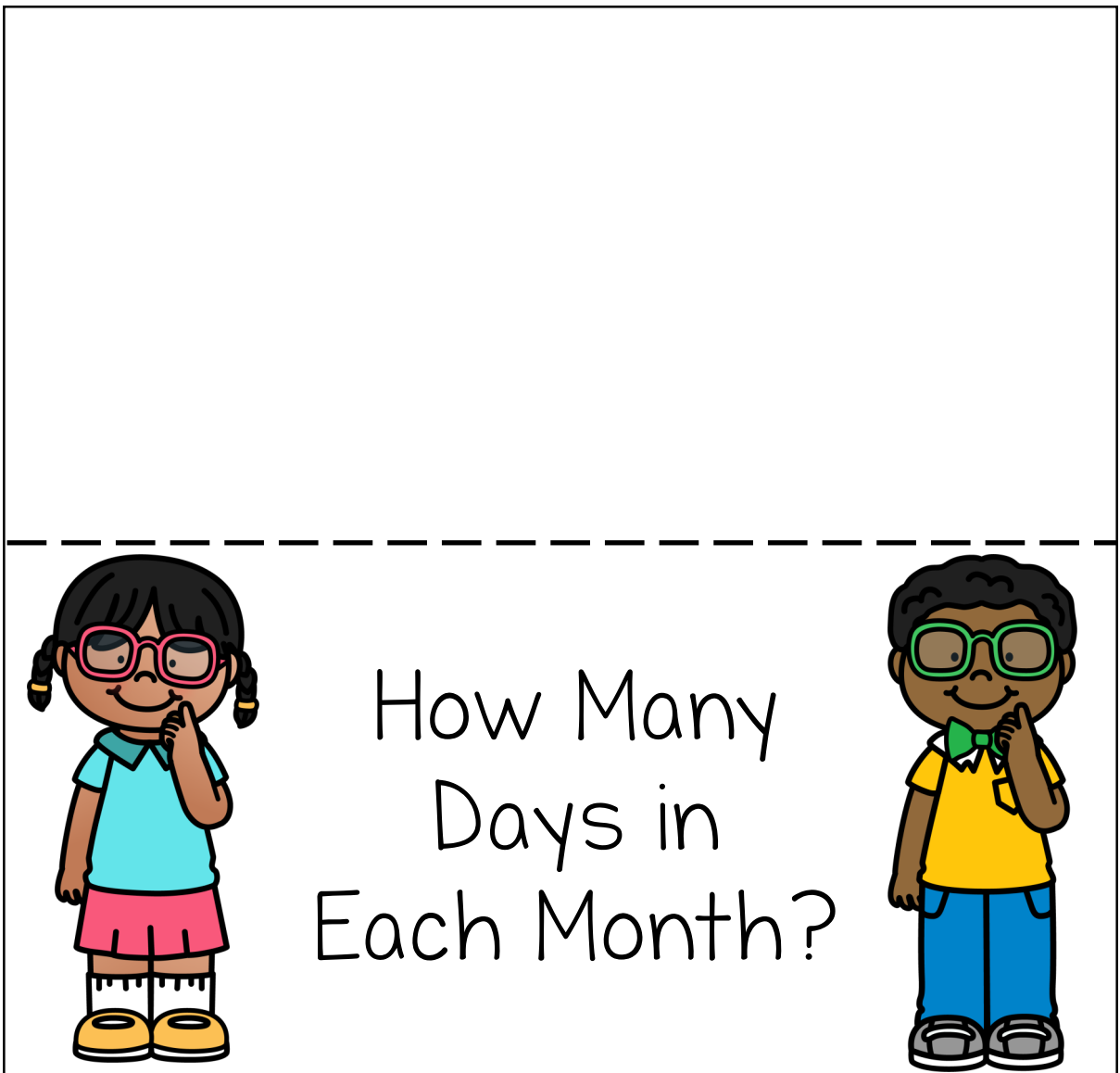

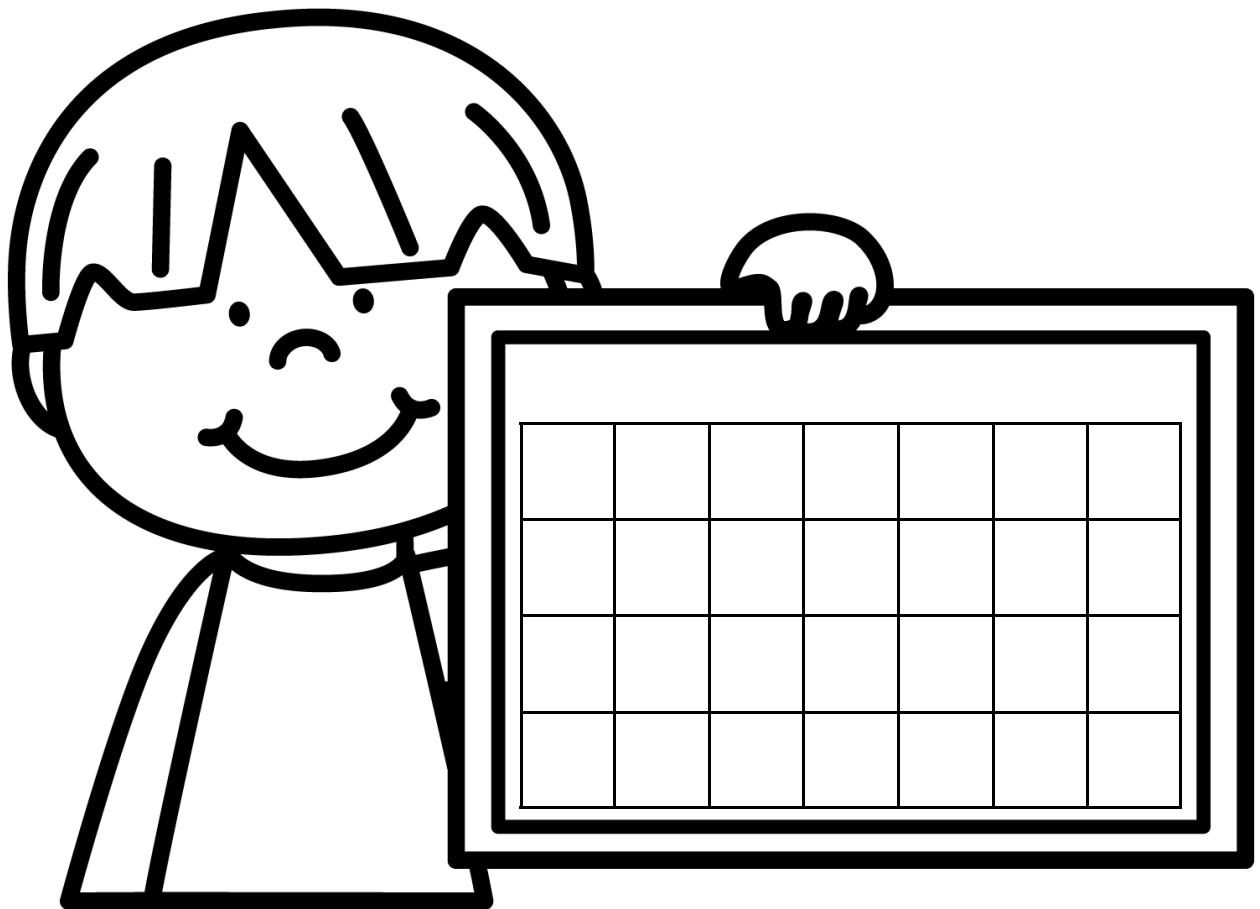

Directions: Cut out book as one piece. Fold in half. Paste the rhyme inside the book.













Thirty days has September,
