


Cut circles out. Stack together with cover on top and secure with a brass brad.

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
This book has a circular story. Where is the old woman at the beginning of the book? Where is she when the story is over? After you assemble the wheel, write the woman's first house at the top. Move the wheel and write her next home. Continue until you have written all her homes on the wheel. The final one will be at the top (right where she started!).



Look up the word contentment in the dictionary. Write the definition inside the book. Cut book out on the solid lines. Using the dotted lines as your guide, fold like a matchbook.



Cut the book out on the solid lines. Fold on the dotted. Answer the questions under the flaps.



The fairy claims that the old woman won't be content **anywhere**. Do you think this is true? Why?

The Bible gives us verses about contentment. Read through the verses below. Pick one to memorize and think about ways you can show contentment in your own life.

Cut on the solid lines. Glue the strips together as indicated. Fold like an accordion.



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
"... I have Learned to be content whatever the circumstances." Philippians 4:11b

and every situation, whether well fed or hungry, whether Living in plenty or in want." Philippians 4:12 Certain elements of a story are usually present in a fairy tale. Fairy tales usually take place "long ago" and have special beginning words such as "Once upon a time", and ending words such as "lived happily ever after". Fairy Tales usually have both a good character and an evil character, and the good character usually wins in the end. There is almost always royalty and castles present in a fairy tale, and sometimes magic. You will also find things grouped in threes or sevens in fairy tales.*

Think about *The Old Woman Who Lived in a Vinegar Bottle*. Do you think this book is a fairy tale? Be a fairy tale detective and use the clues in the story to determine your answer. Use the pages on this page and the next to record your research.

When you are finished, cut the pages out and stack them together with the cover on top. Staple at the top of the book.




