In order to complete this A New Coat for Anna Lapbook, you will need to help your student complete some research for World War II. You may also want to research and learn more about sheep.

Mini-Books Included:

Look How I Have Grown

Record your student's growth. You can choose from two options.

Precious Metals and Stones

Learn about garnet and gold.

How Did Anna Get Her Coat?

This is a sequencing activity with five mini-books. After you read the story a few times, your student should be able to remember what Anna needed for her coat. You can also use these mini-books as an opportunity to teach ordinal numbers (first, second, third, etc.)

What They Traded Wheels

Review the word bartering (label is included). Use the wheels to match-up the items that were exchanged.

World War II Tab Book

Check out some library books and learn a bit about World War II. Use the tab book to paste weapons to the appropriate places (land, air, or sea). Use the additional blank areas on each page to write World War II facts.

World War II Enemies and Allies Chart

Sort the countries and paste them to the chart. Color the map accordingly. Add the map and chart to your lapbook.

Anna Thanked the Sheep

How did Anna thank the sheep? Add the sheep and apples to your lapbook.

Four Seasons Envelope Fold

Review the seasons. Write one season on each flap. Paste or draw pictures for each season under the flaps.

Lamb of God Matchbook

Paste the picture and Bible verse inside the matchbook.

Christmas Simple Fold Book

Discuss Christmas and traditions. Add the text to the inside of the book.

Germany Mini-books

Learn more about Germany and complete the map and flag mini-books.

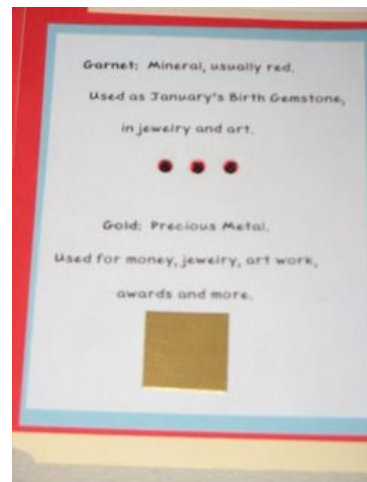
Supplies you will need for this piece.

3-5 little gem stones in deep red (or a couple larger sized ones). You should be able to find these at any craft store in a small bag. Or you could find a picture on line of a garnet stone and just copy that off.

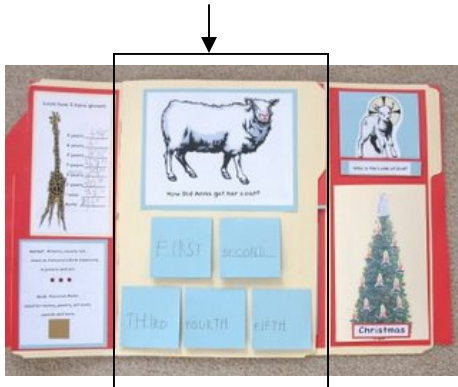
1 small piece of gold paper. I found mine in the scrapbook area of JoAnns. Cut to about an 1" x 1" square.

Garnet is a mineral that is usually red. It is used as January's birth gemstone, in jewelry, and in art.

Gold is a precious metal used for money, jewelry, artwork, and awards.

How did Anna get her coat?

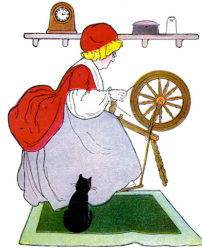
Cut out title piece above. Back with colored paper, if desired. Choose which set of books to cut out (with or without words on the front). Cut on black lines and fold on dotted. Cut/paste information to the inside of the little books.

Section C: What They Traded Wheels

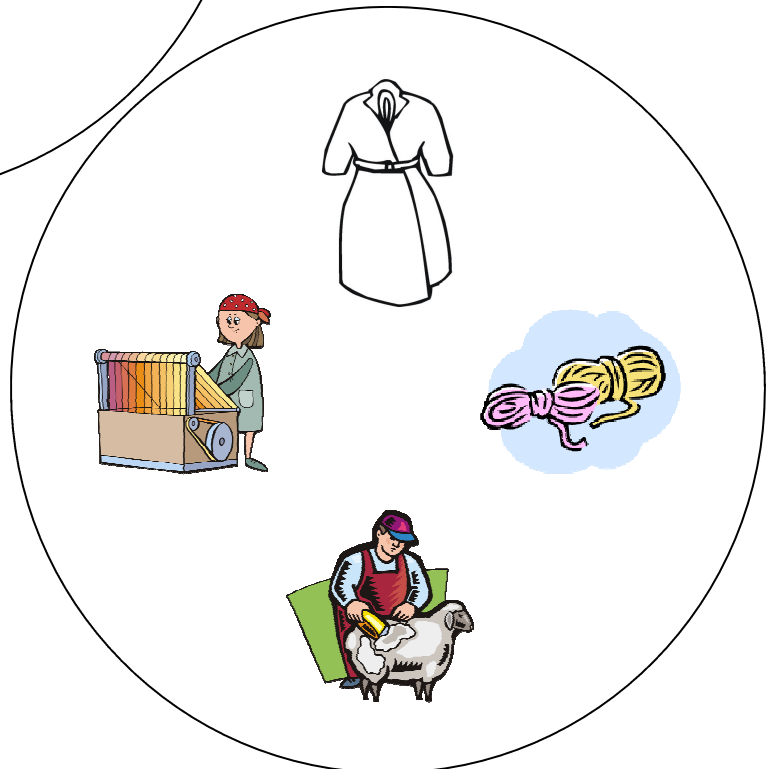
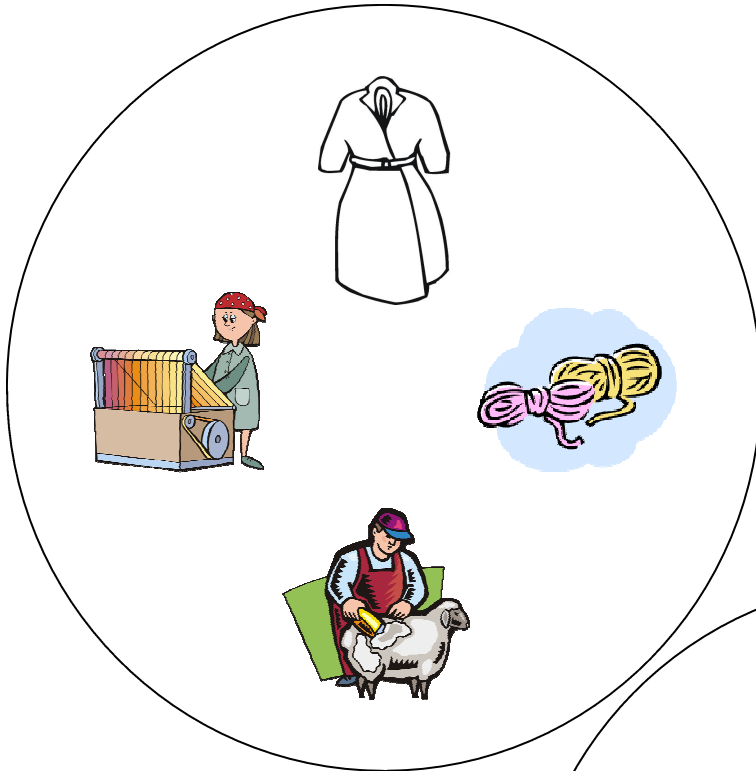
Print all the wheel pages (four total) on cardstock. Cut out wheels. Cut away the window pieces using an exacto knife. Put wheels together with brads. Poke brad through the extra piece of cardstock before fastening. Glue title question and barter definition on the cardstock page. Put glue on the back of the cardstock (avoiding the brad areas) and paste entire page to your lapbook.



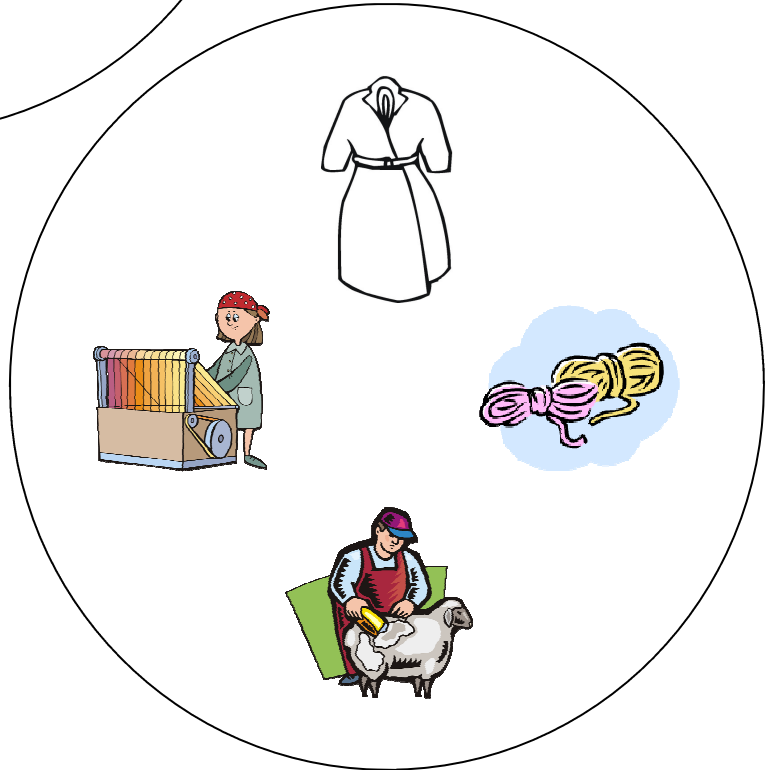
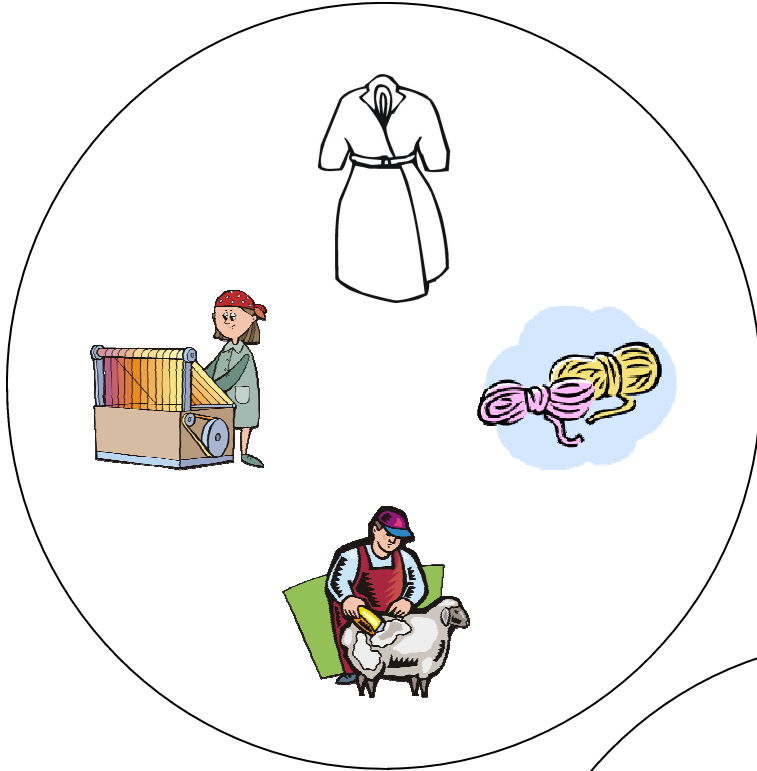

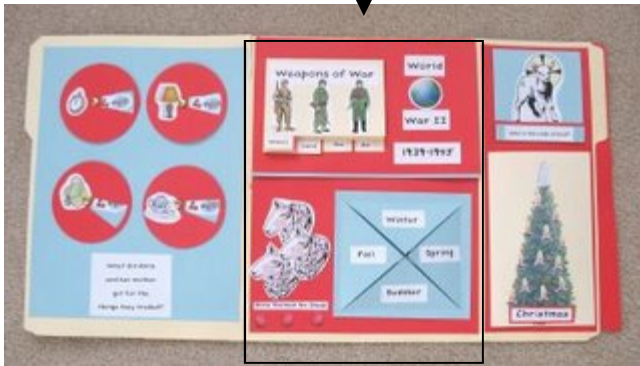

Section D: World War II, thanking sheep and seasons



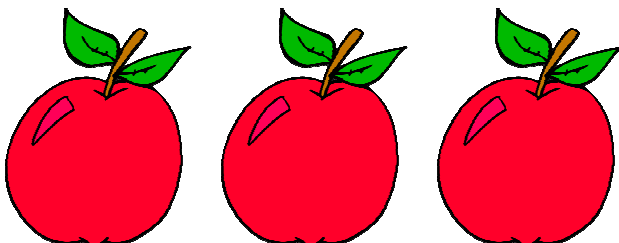
Fold a piece of cardstock in half. This will be the top portion of Section D. Glue the tab book and the WWII pieces to the top of the book as shown. When you open the book, it should look like this

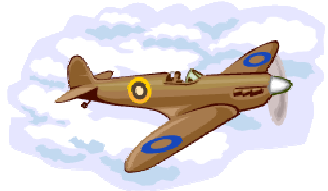
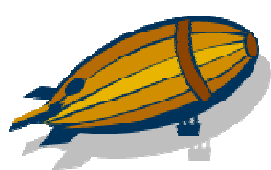
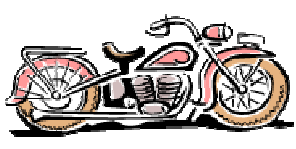
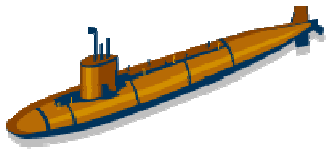
Cut the four strips along the solid outer lines. If there is a rectangle piece in the right corner of the strip, cut it off. Stack your strips in order with cover on top and staple where indicated. Paste weapons to appropriate places. You can also have your student write out some facts in the blank area.




Cut out the sheep and wording and place on the left of the season section. I overlapped them and had my son add a couple apple stickers. Your student could draw some apples or use apples on first page of this file.

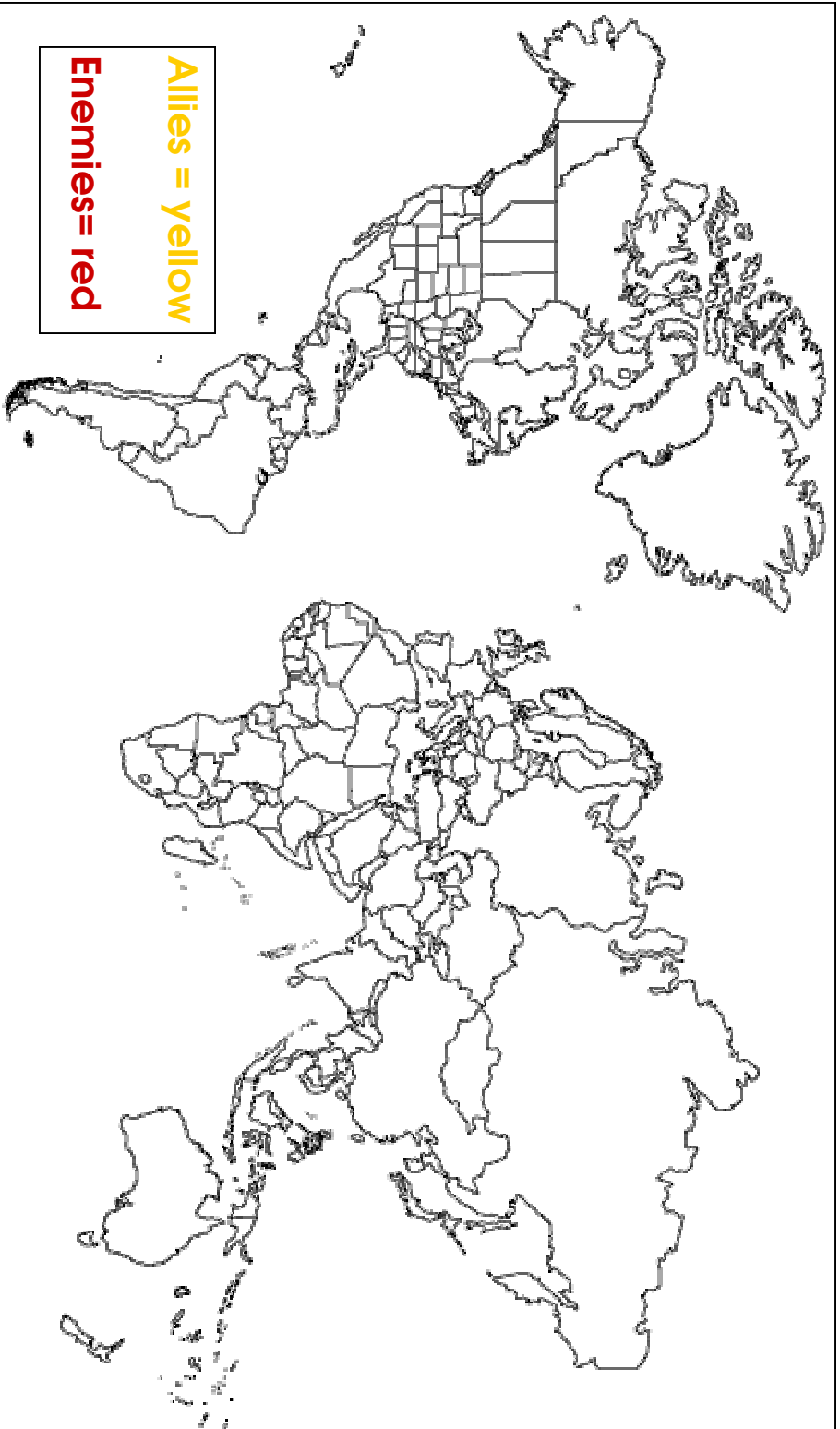

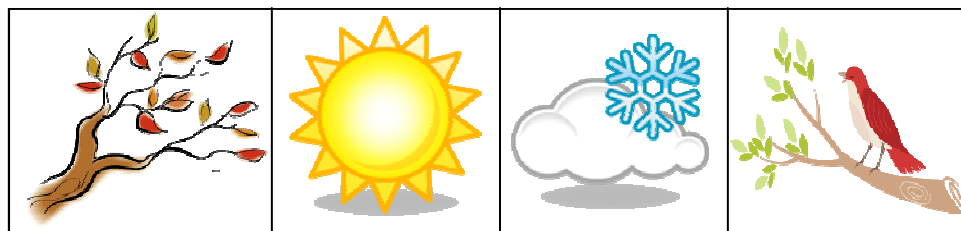
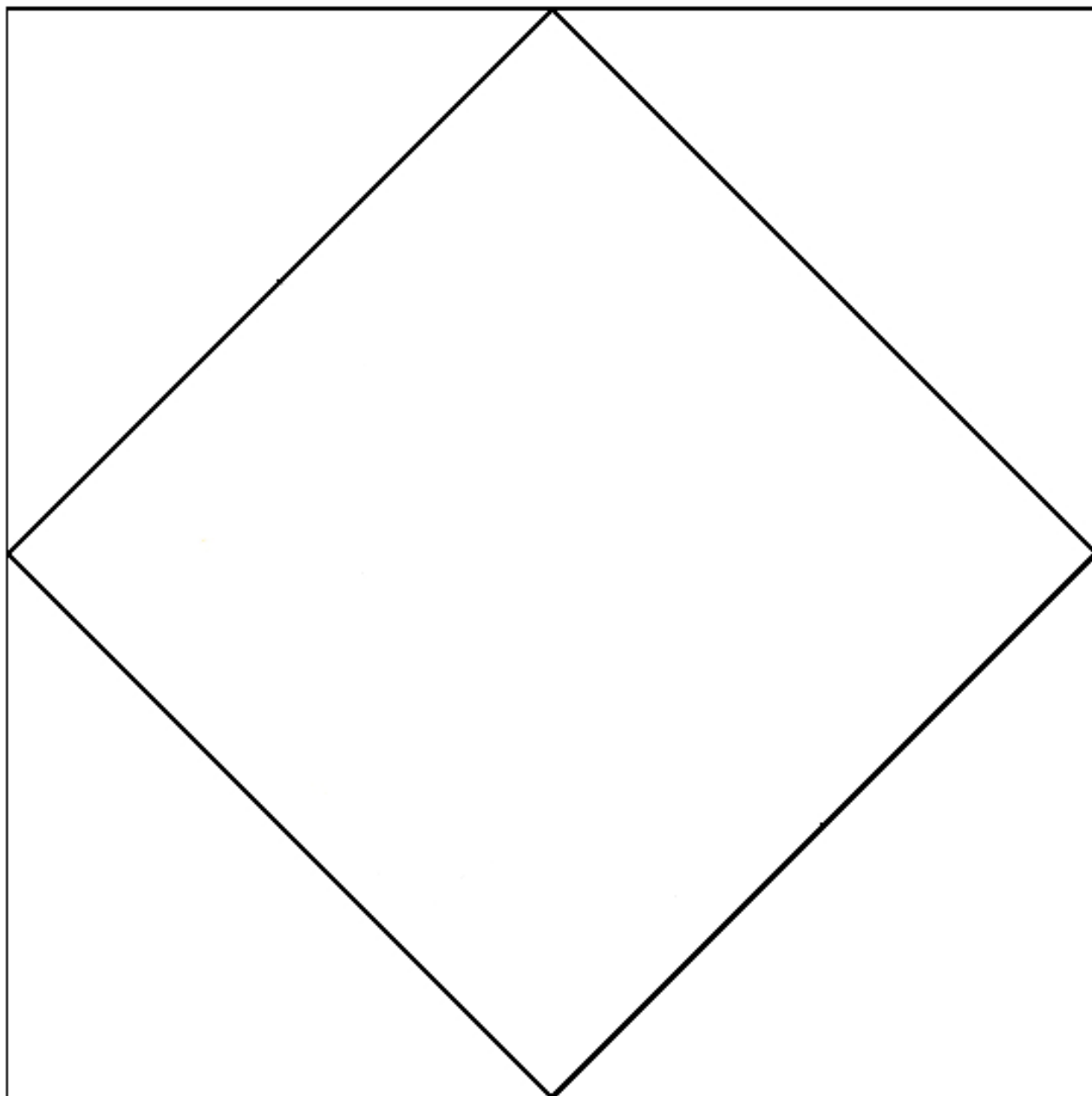

Four Seasons

Cut book out as one piece. Fold flaps to front. Write one season on each flap. Under the flaps paste the appropriate pictures and add text as desired. In the middle paste (or write) the title- Four Seasons.

Section E: Who is the Lamb of God and Christmas

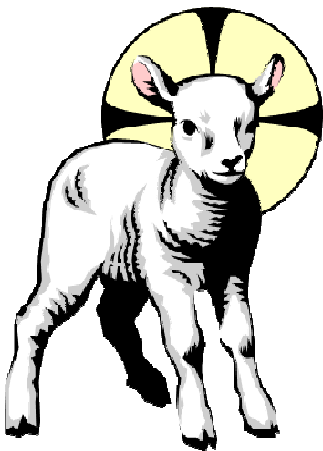
Cut book out. Fold on lines (matchbook style). Cut and paste pieces to the inside of the matchbook. An older student may write the verse instead of cutting and pasting it.

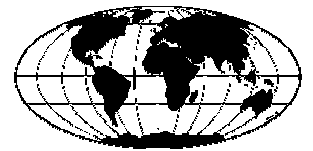


Section F:
Back side-Weave project pocket holder

Cut cardstock to create a pocket to hold the project. Since your child may create a weaving that is different in size...I am not including any particular instructions. The easiest pocket fold is to size your weaving project and allow for about $\frac{1}{2}$ " more space around the sides and bottom and then add another $\frac{1}{2}$ " for the folding-so in total about 1" per side. When cut, fold the sides/bottom about $\frac{1}{2}$ " in (to make folding easier you can clip a bit off of the bottom corner which overlaps the edge folds) and that is what you paste down only (the flaps) allowing the top and middle to remain free from glue so you can slip the project in easily. Place on the back of the file folder.

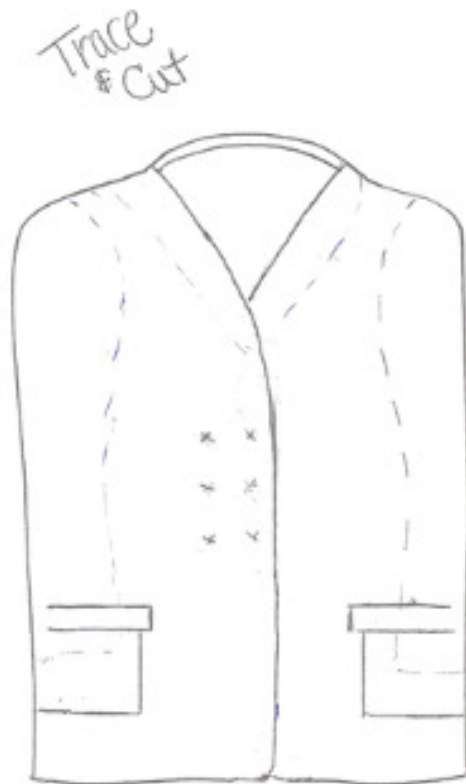
Cut "Flag of _____" book

You will need red cardstock-one sheet

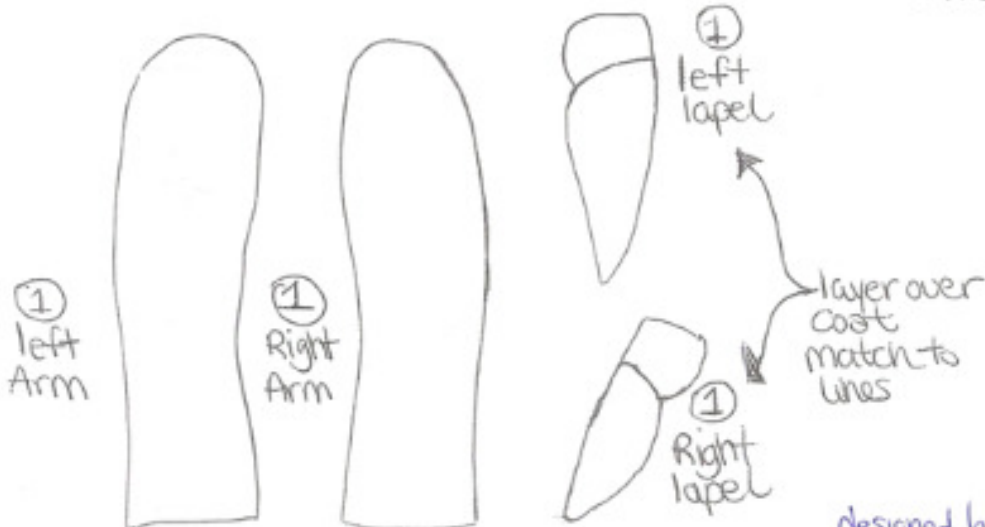
Cut out the body of the coat, the arms, and the lapels. Assemble as shown. I copied the pattern directly onto the red cardstock. That way I had all the pockets and markings already there.

6 mini gold brads-you can find these at any scrapbook section. They usually come in a package of 50 or more. Overlay the cut out parts on top of the body of the coat as pictured.



*run through copier with Red, thinner Cardstock. Cut out, layer & attach 6 mini-brads on "X's" for buttons.

Secure to cover of Lapbook, with title
