


Cut pocket out as one piece. Fold back up. Wrap flaps around the back and glue down. If desired, find a copy (or the beginning) of the Declaration of Independence and store it in this pocket. You could also have your student copy a portion of the declaration and keep it in the pocket (see quote on this page for an idea).

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Cut out as one piece. Cut the grey triangles off. Fold each flap so that the words are on the front of the book. After you make the four folds, you will have a square in the middle. Cut and paste title piece (Third Trip) to the square. Answer each question under the appropriate flap.







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
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
Cut each book out as one piece. Fold in half.
