





## The Iroquois are Five Nations


Cut out The Iroquois are Five Nations heading and glue it below the five flaps. Inside each flap write information about each tribe.


Cut out the rectangle as one piece. Fold on solid lines. You should have a book that opens like the "shutters" on a window.




For best results print on cardstock. Color the side flaps brown to resemble a longhouse. Cut on the outside lines as one shape. Fold the bottom flap up and the sides in.








# Iroquois Names








How Were Iroquois Children Punished?

Cut out the two rectangles and fold on dotted lines. Write facts about Longnose and other punishments inside rectangle # 1.


## Prepare the Longnose pop-up:

Decorate the inside of rectangle 2 to represent the Longnose mask. Color the triangle/nose if desired. Cut out the triangle and fold in half from tip to bottom center. Fold back tabs (valley fold) on dotted lines and glue tabs to the card where indicated to form the nose of your mask. (See photo for help in placement.)

### Assemble the book:

Glue the two folded rectangles together where indicated to form a multi-page book.

Cut out book. Fold each triangle flap under. Fold book in half on dotted line. When you open the book, there should be four flaps to life and record information.




PRINT ON CARDSTOCK. Cut out the shapes. Stack together with cover on top and secure with a brad.


**Print onto cardstock**. Cut out the showshoe shapes and hole punch on the end where indicated on the title page. Draw the deer leather netting on the cover.

Write facts about snowshoes on the inside pages. Join the pages together with a paper fastener. Affix the back page to the lapbook or store it in a pocket.







Cut out wheels. Cut away the extra area on the cover wheel where indicated. In the three spaces on the bottom wheel, write the three types of Iroquois healers: herbalists, surgeons, and medicine societies. (Or cut out the words provided and glue them on.) Decorate with drawings as desired. Attach wheels together using a brass fastener.





Print on cardstock. Cut out both pieces. Cut the slit on the dotted line of the FRONT piece. Insert the PULL TAB through the slit. When you glue down the book, make sure to glue only around the outermost edges and not in the center. You want the slider to remain free to move up and down.


Print all on cardstock. Cut out the pocket. Fold back flap up and wrap side flaps around the back and glue down. Glue the back of your pocket into your lapbook. Cut out the cards and write or draw what work the Iroquois did during each season. Store the cards in the pocket.








**FOLDER**



On the inside pages of the book, draw simple stick figures to retell the Iroquois creation story.

(The animal on

the cover is a muskrat, the animal that brought back dirt to create the island of Earth in the legend.)

Cut book out as one piece. Fold in half. Open. Fold bottom strip up (fold on the dotted lines) to form a pocket on the inside of the book. Use small dots of glue on the edges (if you use too much, the pockets will be too small). For cards, use standard 3x5" index cards or the templates on the following pages. Write facts about each holiday on the cards.




