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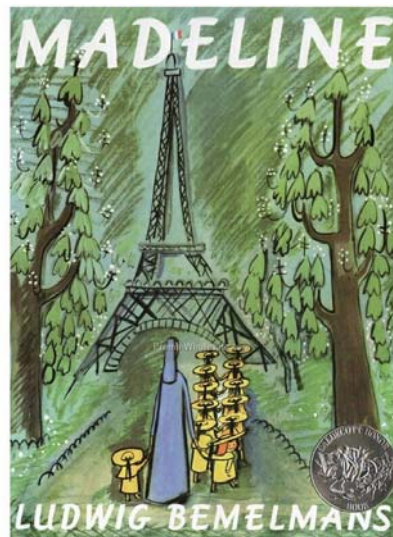
Rhyming Words

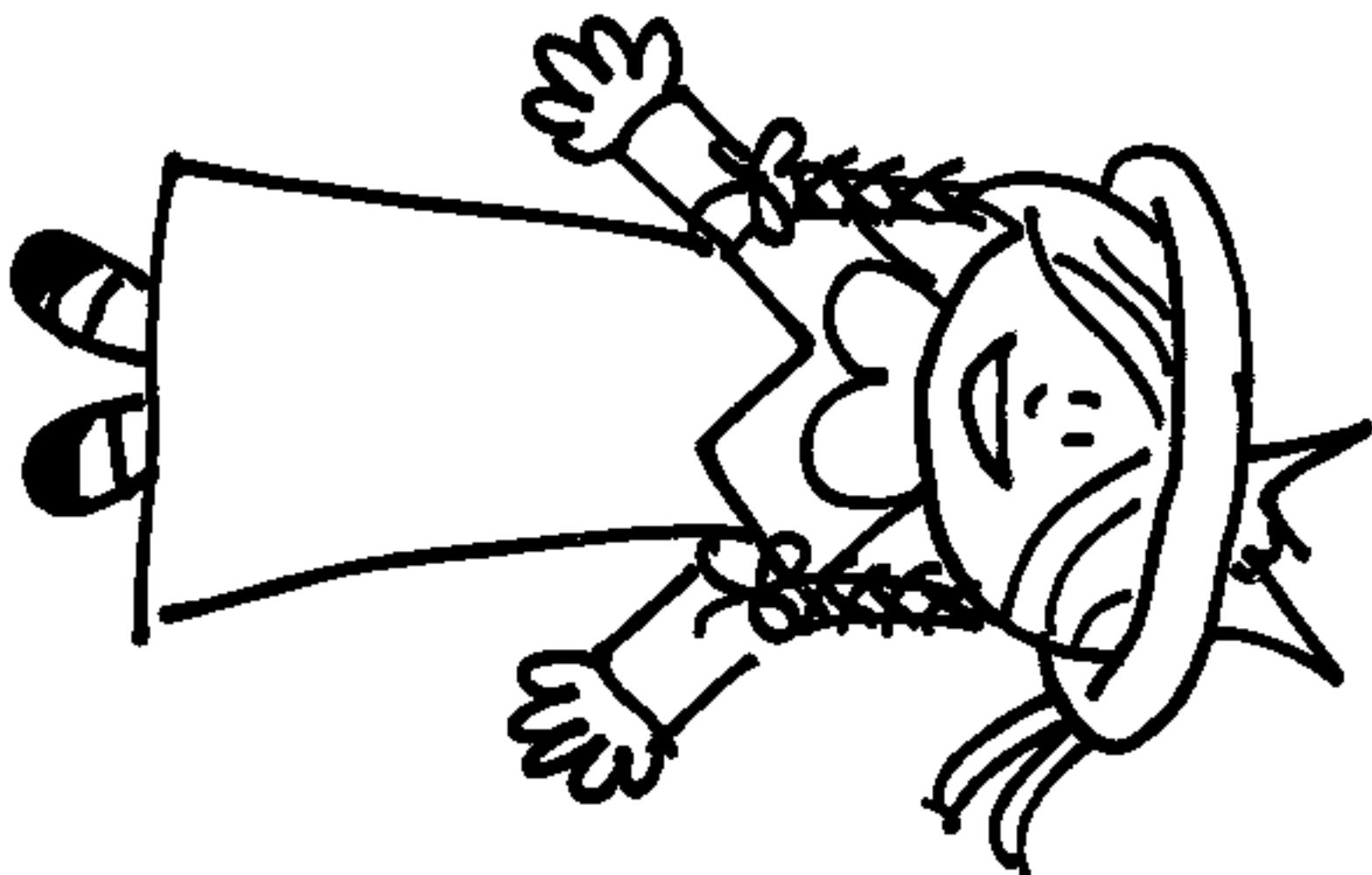
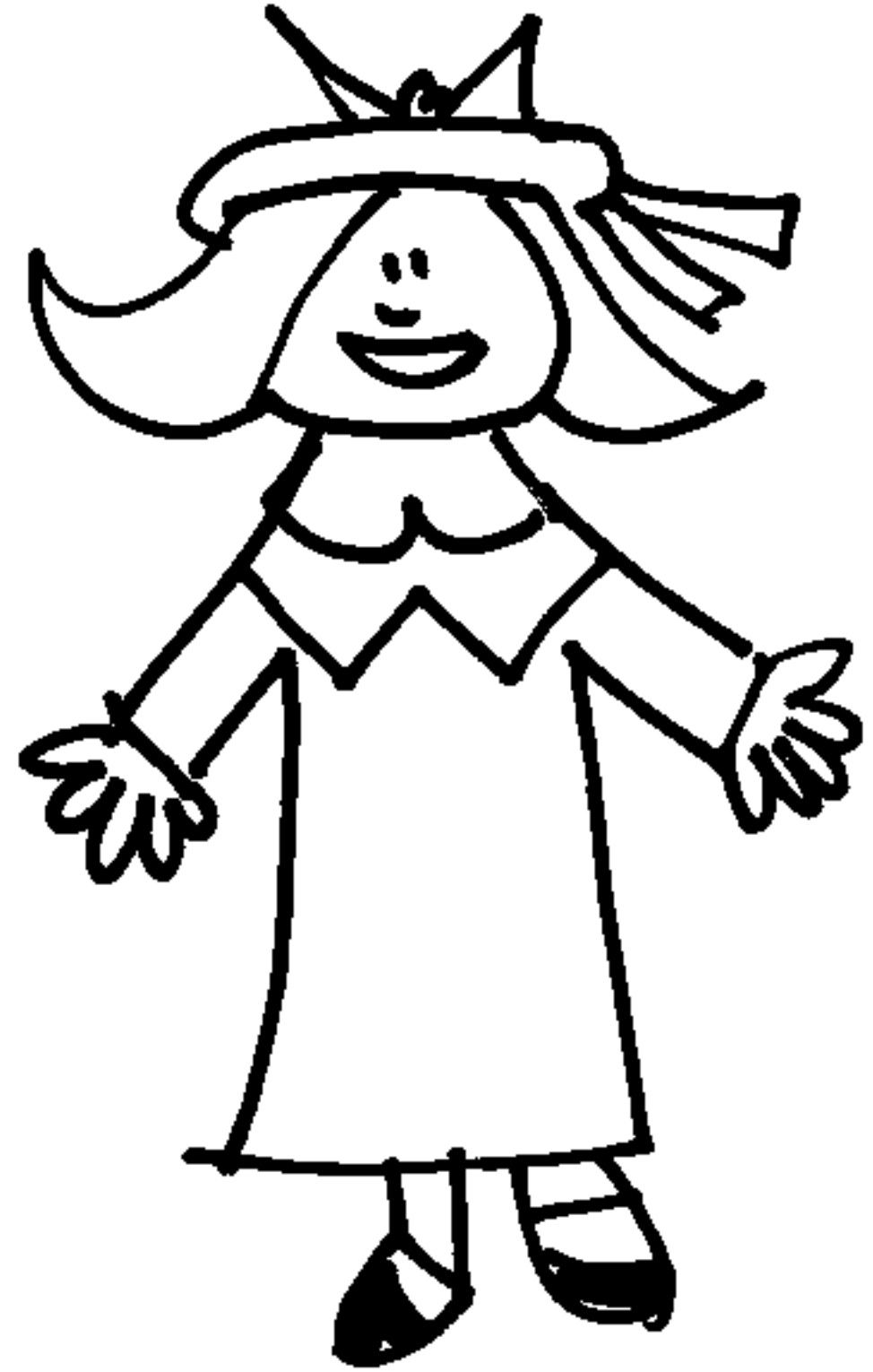
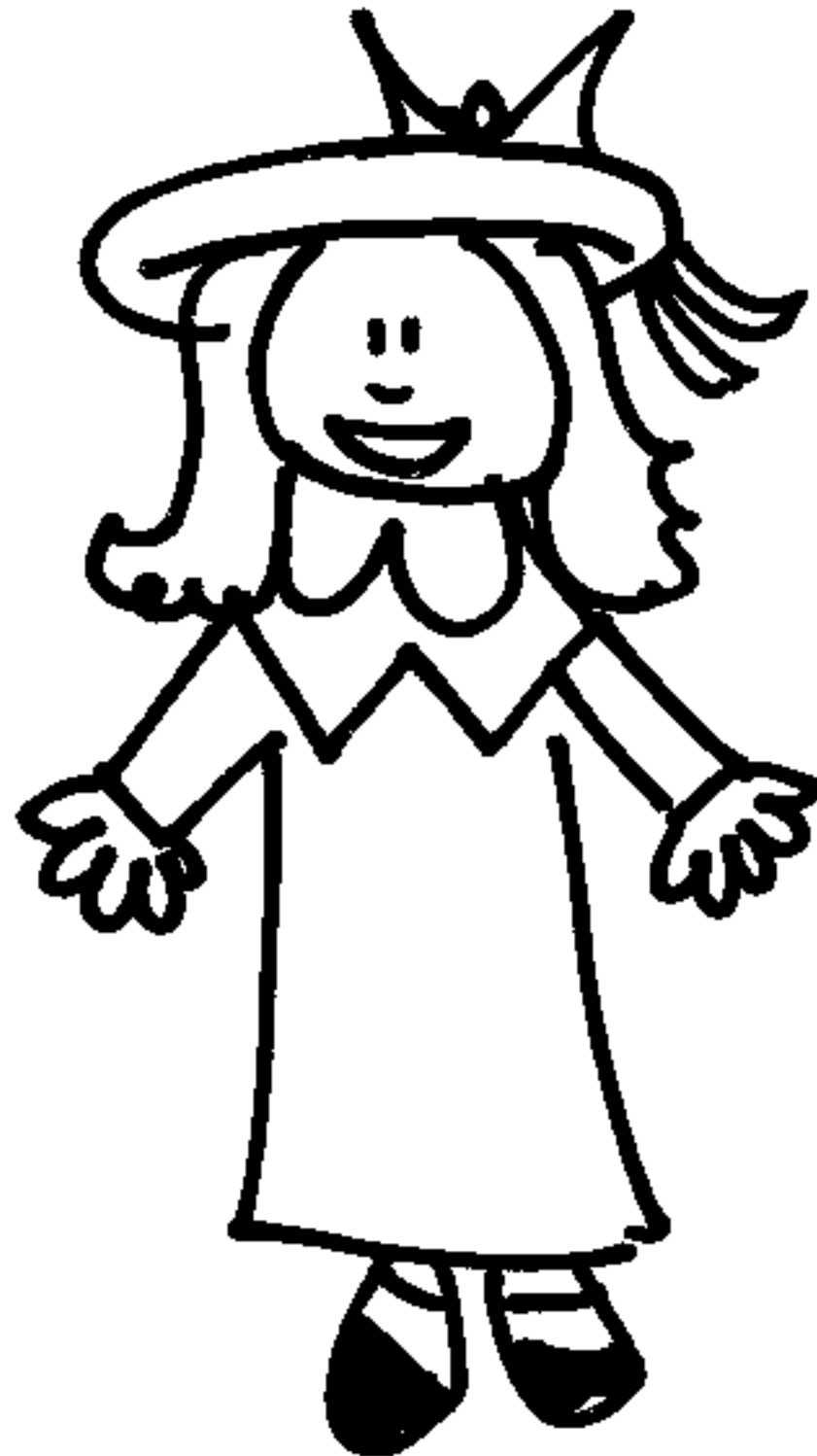
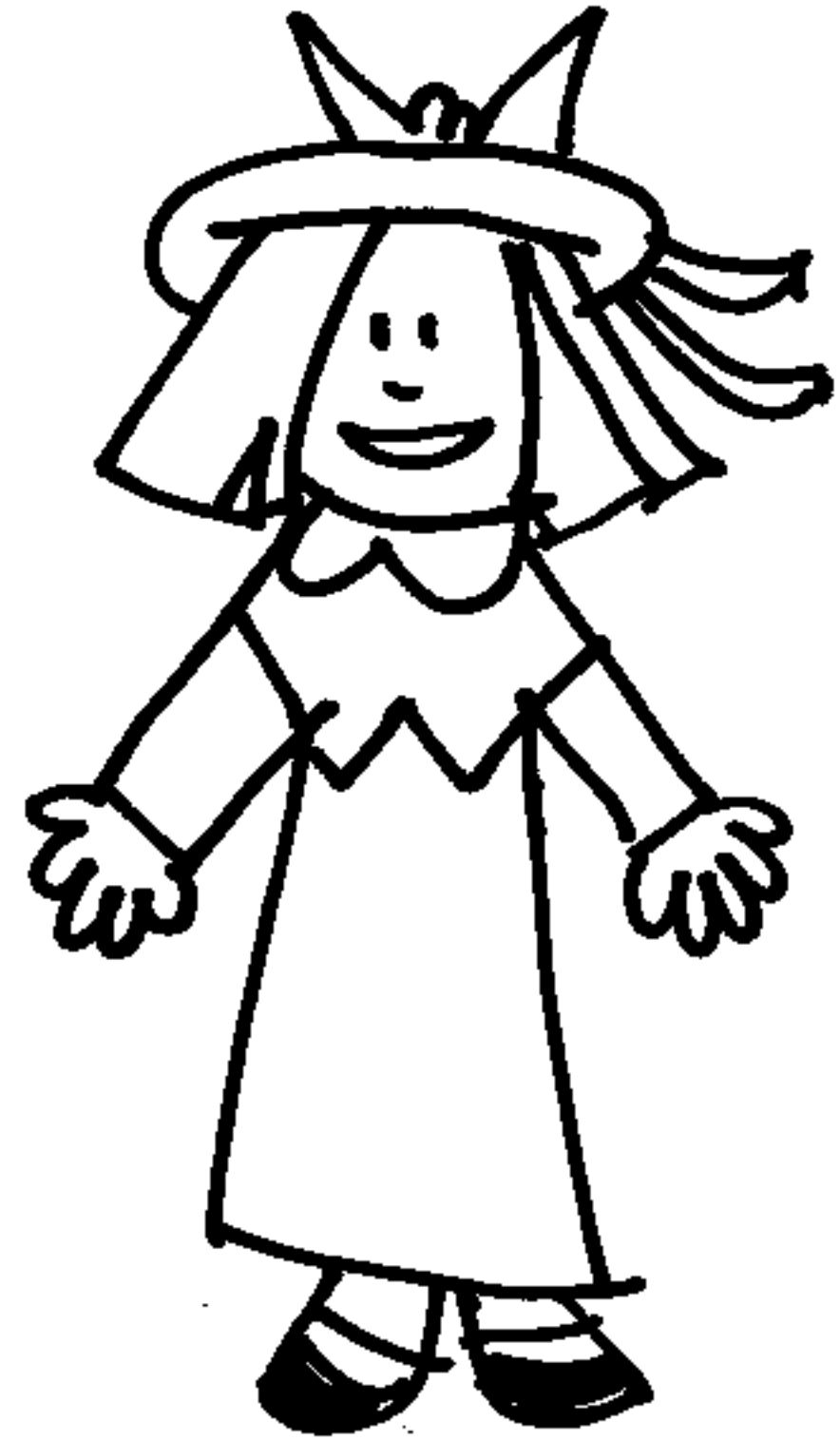


Madeline Math

You can use the girls on the next page as manipulatives to play math!

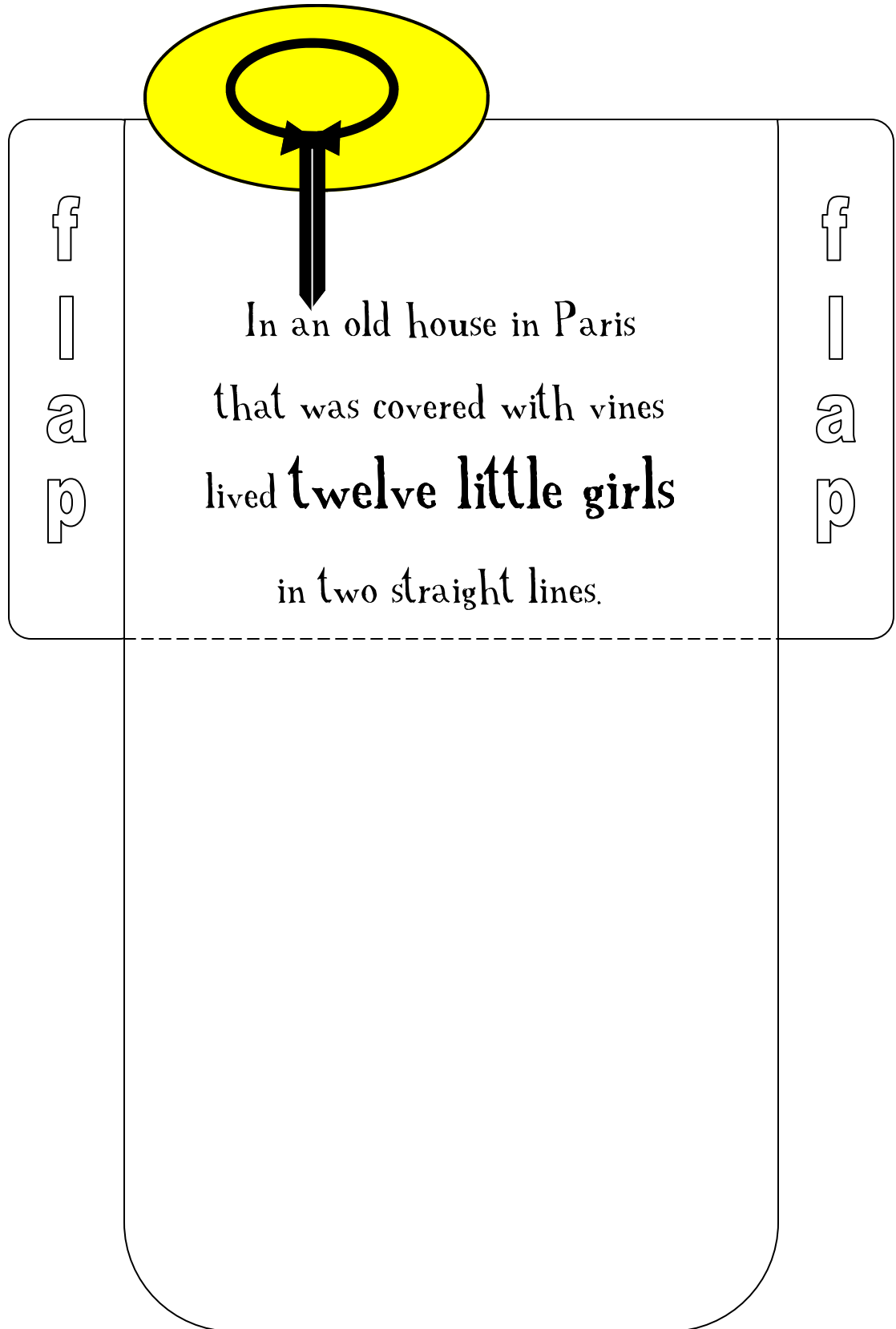
Use them for simple addition and subtraction problems.

Look through the illustrations in this story. What stands out to your student? Some of the illustrations are monochromatic (only one color is used).

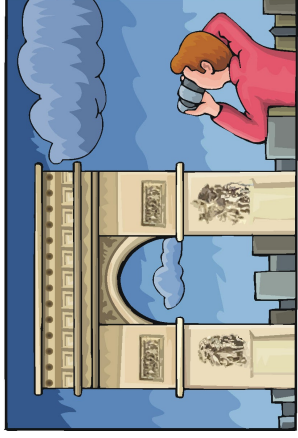
Print this [free printable](#) from Crayola twice. Ask your student to color one however he wants, but to color the other choosing just one color (various shades can be used).

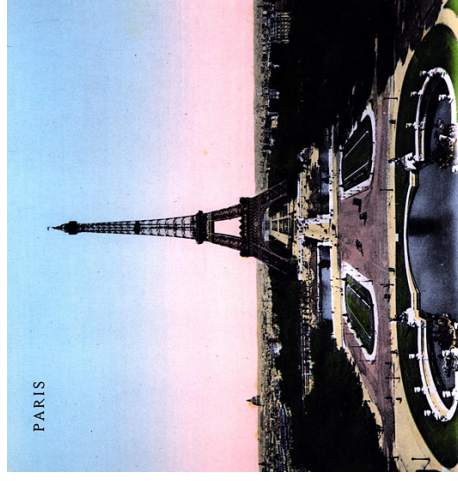
Opera

What does your typical day look like? Use the clocks to map out your day.

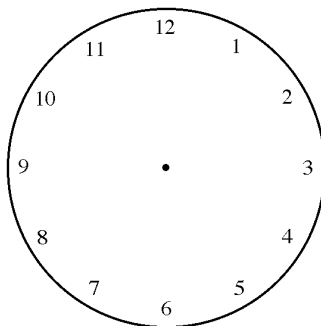
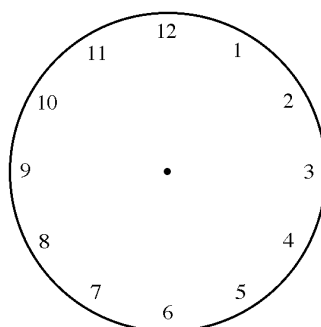
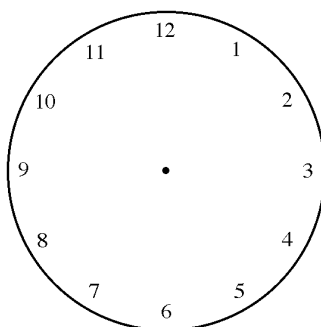
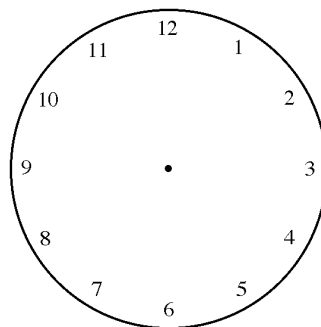
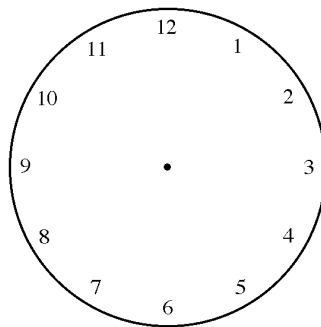

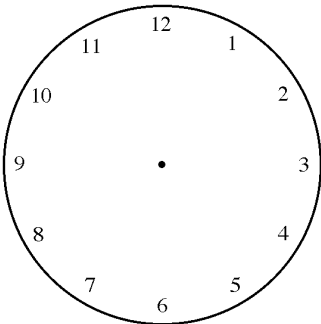
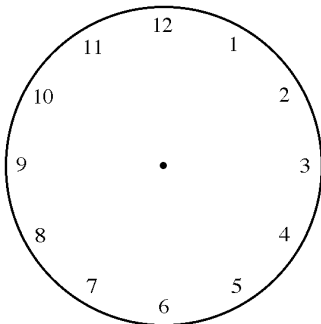
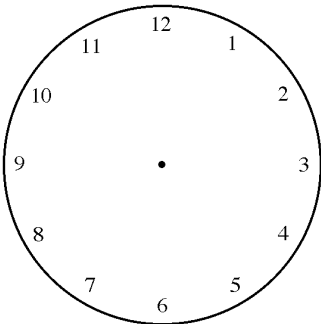
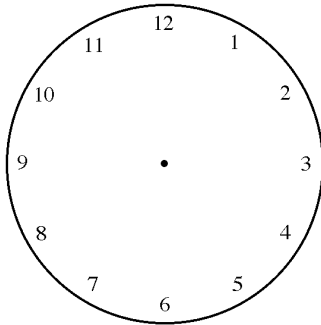
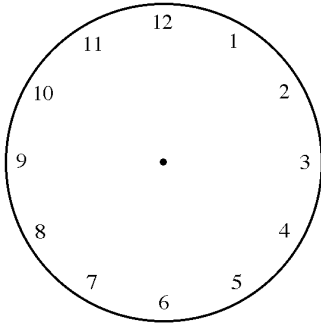
Assembly Directions:
