


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#### **Rhyming Words**


Part of the fun of this story is that it rhymes! Discuss rhyme with your student. Do you have other rhyming stories at your house? Find them and read them!


#### **Madeline Math**

Look through the illustrations in this story. What stands out to your student? Some of the illustrations are monochromatic (only one color is used).


Print this <u>free printable</u> from Crayola twice. Ask your student to color one however he wants, but to color the other choosing just one color (various shades can be used).




## MADELINE

What does your typical day look like? Use the clocks to map out your day.




#### **Assembly Directions:**







