Day 1

Day 2

~read "Auguste Bartholdi" and discuss

~complete "Auguste Bartholdi – continuing the dream" minit book

~complete "Where did Bartholdi..." minit book

Day 3

~read "Marie Simon" and discuss

~complete "Making the Models" pop-up book & "Materials" minit book

Day 4

~read "Gustave Eiffel" and discuss

~research & complete "Who was Gustave Eiffel?" minit book & "Gigantic Proportions" minit book

Day 5

~read "Emma Lazarus" and discuss

~complete poem copywork

<u>Day 6</u>

~read "Charels P. Stone" and discuss

extra book: You Wouldn't Want to be a Worker on the Statue of Liberty (note: I have not previewed this.)

Day 7

"read "Joseph Pulitzer" (March 1885) & "Florence De Foreest" and discuss

~complete Joseph Pulitzer/money flap book

Day 8

~read "Joseph Pulitzer" (August 1886) and discuss

~complete "Problems" accordion book

Day 9

~read "Jose Marti" and discuss

~read "Auguste Bartholdi" and discuss

~complete "dream/dedicated" shutter, liberty quote, and "Symbolism" shutterfold








This is a pop-up book. First, print book on cardstock. Mountain fold the book in half on the dotted line. Snip the two solid lines. Fold that flap down towards you on the dotted line. Now, valley fold the book in half, on the dotted line, popping the box to the inside of the book. Cut out the small rectangle and paste or draw a picture on it. On the box marked "glue" glue the item you want to pop-up sitting level with the paper. Make sure it lies flat when closing the book.




Cut out book as one piece. Matchbook fold (opening flap will be on the right side of the matchbook). Use picture to paste inside the matchbook, if desired.





Use picture book to go in minit book on previous page.


Cut all three pieces out (two are on the next page. Stack together with cover on top and staple on left side. Use book to record the height and weight.


