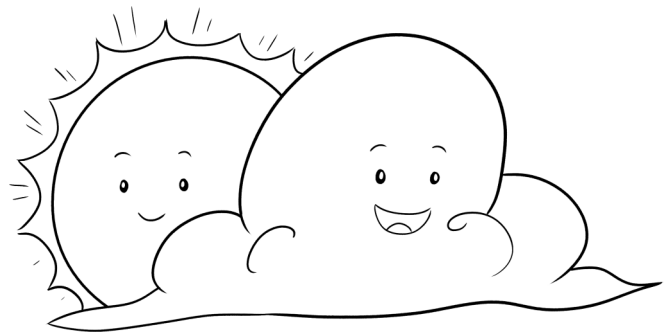

Three Basic Cloud Types

Stratus

Low-level clouds that look like flat sheets

Cumulus

Mid-level clouds that look like fluffy cotton balls; if you spot these clouds then rain might be on the way

Cirrus

High clouds that are thin and wispy; they are made of ice

How Do Clouds Form?

1. The sun warms the earth's surface.
2. Water begins to evaporate.
3. Water vapor (an invisible gas) rises.
4. The water vapor cools and forms a cloud.

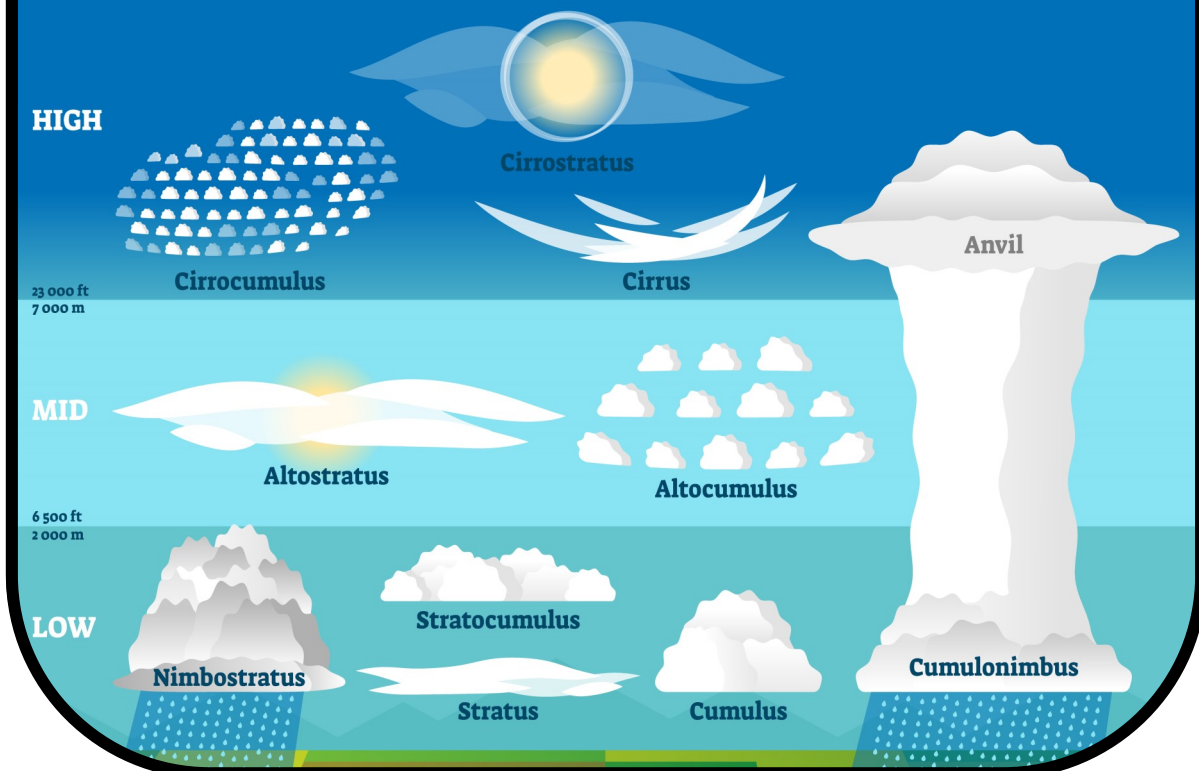

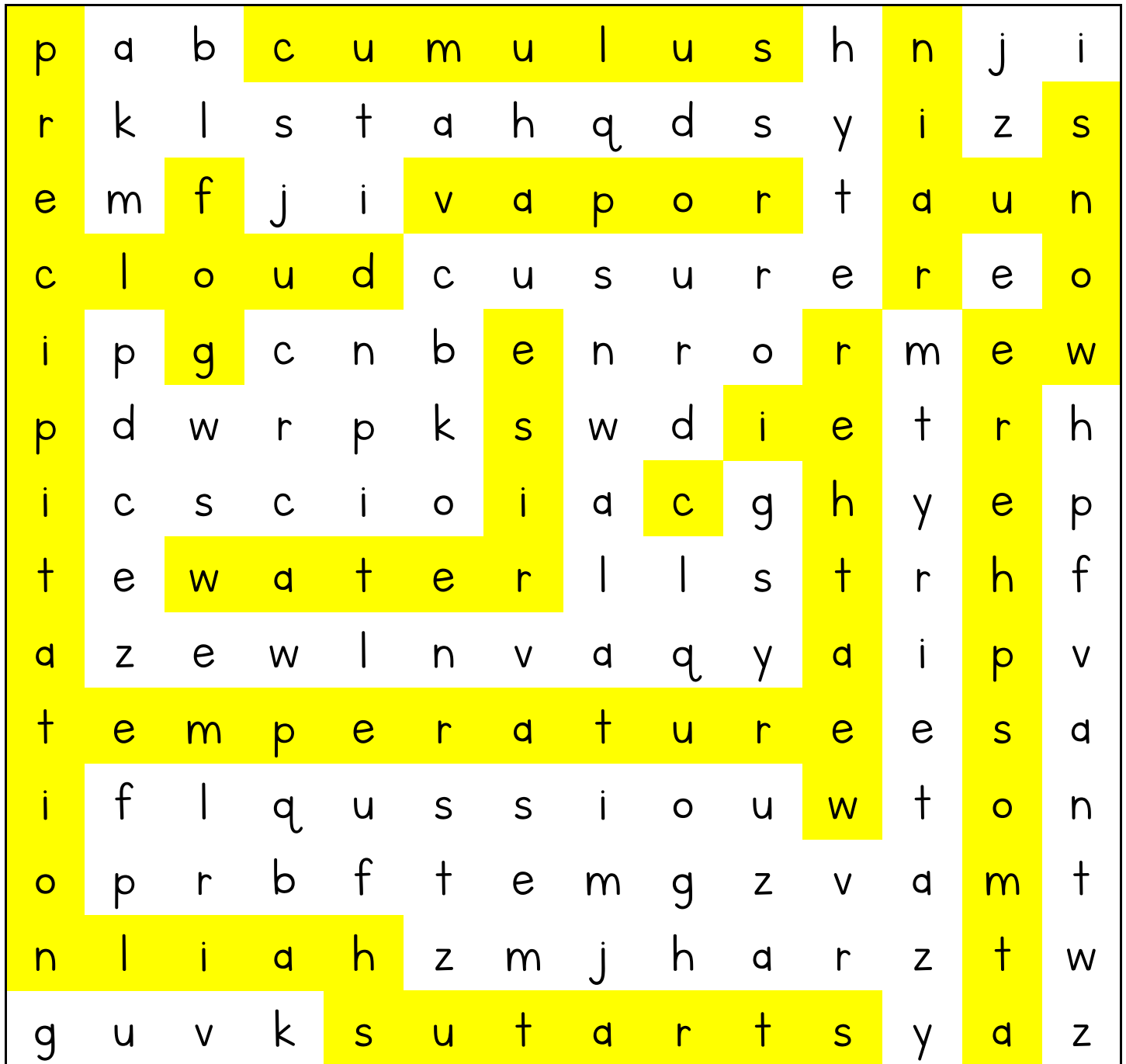


